Aconitum carmichaelii 'Spatlese'	Meaning 'Late Harvest', this monkshood has pale lilac-blue flowers loosely held on upright stems that can reach 1.8m . Part sun / Shade.	7.50
Aconitum carmichaelii 'Arendsii'	An old favourite (1945) from Germany, for the late summer border with its bold upright spikes of deep purple- blue, helmet-like flowers. Up to 1.8m. Part shade.	7.50

Allium senescens subsp. glaucum	An excellent border front candidate, the twisted glaucous foliage topped with domed heads of lilac-pink flowers on 20cm spikes. Sun.	7.20
Allium thunbergii 'Osawa'	A tiny Japanese species which brings the allium season to a close with its late flurry of pale purple flowers over narrow glossy leaves in Sept/Oct. Sun. 15cm	7.20

Alstroemeria 'Evening Song'	A brilliant addition to the colour range, a glowing crimson-purple. Try it with your 'Old' roses. Sun / Part Shade. 70cm.	7.50
Alstroemeria 'Red Elf'	Large glowing carmine flowers provide a display for months. It belongs at the border front and will survive bitter winters uncomplainingly. Sun / Part Shade. 45cm. AGM.	7.50

Althaea officinalis 'Alba'	Dainty white cupped flowers over a long summer season on this lofty grey leaved perennial. Excellent with grasses. Sun. 2m	7.50
Ammi majus	A terrific lofty annual/biennial umbellifer holding its shallow domed discs of pure white flowers on 2-3m stems. Impeccable grey winter tracery. Sun / Part Shade.	6.80
Amsonia 'Graham's Hybrid'	A possible A.taebermontana hybrid occurring here. Good foliage and clusters of pale blue-mauve flowers together with fall colour. Sun / Part Shade. 80cm.	7.50
Amsonia illustris	With broad, willow shaped leaves that colour beautifully in the autumn and pale turquoise blue stary flowers in summer, this genus deserves to be better known. Sun / Part Shade. 90cm	7.50
Amsonia orientalis	Awash with small stary slatey-blue flowers displayed on willowy leaved stems through early summer. An exercise in understatement. Sun / Part Shade. 40cm.	7.50

Amsonia orientalis 'Turkish Form'	A more recent wild collection of this Turkish endemic. A solid looking plant with paler flowers than the type, but much longer flowering. Sun / Part Shade. 40cm.	7.50
Anchusa azurea 'Loddon Royalist'	Brilliant azure flowers on branching stems. Likes a free draining soil and good on chalk. Full Sun. 1.5m.	7.50
Anemanthele lessoniana	The evergreen clump of bronzed foliage will by mid July have erupted into a cascade of fine, brown-pink flower panicles. Within a month they will have faded to a mist of gold. Sun / Part Shade. 45cm. AGM.	7.50
Anemone 'Bowles Pink'	A good strong pink Japanese Anemone with two petals slightly paler than the others. Can you tell?! Part Shade. 1m. AGM.	7.50
Anemone nemorosa 'Bowles Purple'	A delicate soft purple wood anemone with a yellow centre. Remember that it goes dormant in summer so remember where you planted it! Best in partial shade. 15cm.	6.90
Anemone hortensis	One of our earliest flowering plants here at Marchants, this mediterranean violet/pink anemone has a blue centre. Such a treat for those bleak February days. Sun /Part Shade. 25cm.	7.80
Anemone hupehensis var. japonica 'Bodnant Burgundy'	Richest pink fine-petalled (slightly doubled?) flowers over a compact plant. Not quite the lightest pinot noir, but a good rich colour. Part Shade. 60cm.	7.50
Anemone nemorosa 'Blue Eyes'	A charming, old, double white Wood Anemone whose central stamens are surrounded by the stain of a purple eye. Shade. 10cm	6.90
Anemone x hybrida 'Geante des Blanches'	Large semi-double white flowers, the narrow ray petals forming a rather flat faced flower. Robust. Part Shade. 1m.	7.50
Anemone x hybrida 'Honorine Jobert'	Pristine and pure – reckoned to be the best white. Part Shade. 1.2m. Sun / Part Shade.	7.50
Anemone x lipsiense vindobonensis	Pale butter yellow flowers are a delight in spring. The young foliage carries a red blush. Full Sun/ Part Shade. 15cm.	6.90
Anthericum racemosum	Starry white flowers in summer on branched slender stems creates an airy effect when established - sun and good drainage preferred. Border, pot or meadow even? 30cm	7.20

Artemisia lactiflora 'Elfenbein'	A great form from the continent with munificent branched heads of ivory white flowers in late summer. Sun / Part Shade. 1.5m.	7.50
Artemisia ludoviciana 'Valerie Finnis'	Grown primarily for the foliage, this Mugwort offers an invaluable silver contrast in the border. AGM. Full Sun. 60cm.	7.50
Arum italicum 'Tiny'	A rare marbled leaf form growing no taller than 20cm. Particularly good amongst winter/spring bulbs. Summer dormant. Sun / Part Shade.	6.90
Asarum splendens	Chinese Wild Ginger. Not a true ginger but possessing ginger smelling roots. The striking silver mottled leaves shield clandestine, large, weird chocolate- purple and white flowers. Shade. 15cm.	7.20
Asclepias incarnata	Willowy stems to 1m terminating in nodding clusters of small, dusky rose pink flowers. Demure, subtle and little known. Sun. 1m.	7.50
Asphodeline liburnica	Later flowering than A.lutea, with bright yellow flowers that stand more prominent from the stem, with a central green vein on each petal. Flowers in June/ July. Full Sun. 1m.	7.50
Aster ageratoides 'Asran'	A lovely pale lilac Aster, generously flowering from September to November and a magnet for bees and butterflies. Gently spreading, so one to keep an eye on. Fabulous with grasses. Sun. 60cm.	7.50
Aster ageratoides 'Ezo Murasaki'	Small purple flowers, pleasingly late, combined with mildew resistance make for a tough, easy going Japanese aster. Sun / Part Shade. 60cm.	7.50
Aster amellus 'Violet Queen'	An old cultivar selected by Karl Forster and which remains unchallenged. Large, rich violet flowers in Sept/Oct. 40cm.	7.50
Aster x frikartii 'Monch'	This is arguably the finest Aster for elegance and flower power, giving a succession of clear lavender blue flowers from midsummer onwards. Sun. 80cm.	7.50
Astrantia 'Buckland'	The pale green ruff of bracts and rosy pink stamens make for a flower of great beauty. Sun /Part Shade. 60cm.	7.50
Astrantia major 'Ruby Wedding'	Richest of ruby-red flowers over a long season. Sun / Part Shade. 60cm.	7.50

Astrantia major ex. 'Canneman'	The parent plant is a hearty grower with large greyish-green flowers, stained a reddish purple. Sun / Part Shade. 50cm.	7.50

Atriplex hortensis var. rubra	Red Orach. This lofty spinach relative, is an annual that will seed about happily, giving a beautiful colour in the border and a tasty salad in the bowl! Sun. 1.5m+	6.80
Baptisia Ex 'Starlite' and Ex 'Nelson's Navy'	Lucky Dip seedlings raised from 2 fine cultivars. Meaning, whatever plant you choose will be one of a kind, so you can name it! Sun. 90cm.	8.00
Baptisia x bicolor ex 'Starlight'	The parent plant has a two toned petal of violet and cream. The seedling should follow suit, but choose one in flower to be sure. Sun. 90cm.	8.00
Bergenia ciliata	Spring flowering with rounded bristly large leaves and short stems of white flowers with pink centres, and good autumn colour in the leaves too! Part sun / Shade 30cm.	7.50
Betonica macrantha 'Superba'	Formerly Stachys, whorls of good sized rose-purple flowers over handsome, leafy clumps. A first class, bomb-proof plant suitable for lazy gardeners. Sun / Part Shade. 50cm. AGM.	7.50
Betonica officinalis 'Alba'	Formerly Stachys, a pretty short white favourite, and pert enough for the border front. Sun / Part Shade. 60cm.	7.50
Betonica officinalis 'Blush'	Formerly Stachys, tight clumps of crimped leaves topped with clusters of blush pink flowers. Very pretty, even in winter with its pert, preserved seed heads. Sun / Part Shade. 35cm.	7.50
Betonica officinalis 'Hummelo'	Formerly Stachys, plantsman Ernst Pagels' fine selection with spikes of lilac-purple flowers in mid-summer. Sun / Part Shade. 35cm. AGM.	7.50

Bouteloua gracilis	A strikingly unusual North American grass, its flowers break horizontally. One that will get noticed. Sun. 60cm.	7.50
Briza media 'Limouzi'	This 'Quaking grass' always steals hearts with its rustling, dark flowers on wiry stems. Sun.. 45cm.	7.50
Briza media 'Golden Bee'	A soft golden version of the Quaking Grass, flowering in June and July. Full Sun. 60cm.	7.50
Bunium bulbocastanum	The native Great Pignut. A pretty white umbel with delicate foliage. The tubers and foliage are edible. Great on chalk. Sun / Part Shade. 45cm.	6.90
Calamagrostis brachytricha	A truly beautiful soft grass from Korea, the smokey purple plumes emerge in late summer then sparkle in the autumn dew. Sun / Part Shade.1.2m. AGM.	7.80
Calamagrostis varia	European Reedgrass. The flowering purple stems fade to the colour of wheat and arch beautifully. Sun/ Part Shade. 60cm.	7.80
Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Karl Foerster'	A vertical thrust of a plant, this bleached biscuit grass is like an exclamation mark in your borders! Sun / Part Shade.1.8m. AGM	7.80
Calamintha subsp. nepeta	Loved by pollinators, becomes a buzzing bee heaven in summer with its massed pale blue flowers. Highly aromatic foliage. Sun. 30cm.	7.20
Calamintha subsp.nepeta 'Blue Cloud'	Flowers pale blue unabashed for months on the toughest of soils. Pulls in the pollinators and makes a refreshing tea. Sun. 30cm.	7.20
Calamintha subsp.nepeta 'White seedling'	A dainty white frothy cloud loved by pollinators. The young leaves make a refreshing tea. Sun. 30cm.	7.20
Campanula patula	The spreading bellflower is becoming increasingly rare in the uk. Forming a rosette in the first year and lateral branches of pale blue, occasionally white bell flowers in the second. Will self sow on poor soil. Sun/Part Shade. 30cm.	6.90
Canna indica	A fresh green, lush and leafy plant with terminal spikes of small red and yellow flowers. The rhizomes need to be harvested and winter cossetted. Full Sun. 1.5m.	9.00
Carex elata 'Aurea'	Bowles's Golden Sedge demands retentive soil to prosper. Quite brilliant in its gold colouring, the flowers in contrast are almost black. Sun/Part Shade. 45cm. AGM.	7.80

Catananche caerulea	The beautiful 'Cupids Dart' thrives on mediterranean soils, with good drainage and full sun, so find an equally suitable spot if you can! 60cm.	7.20
Catananche caerulea 'Alba'	The white Cupids Dart, just as pretty in flower as its seedheads are in autumn. Needs good drainage and full sun. 60cm.	7.20
Cenolophium denudatum	Short of a better description, let's call this Parsley on Speed. Good ferny foliage, refined white flowers and a sympathetic candidate for more relaxed plantings. Sun / Part Shade. 1m.	7.50
Centaurea bella	A neat border front plant with silvery evergreen cut foliage and a generous summer display of lilac-pink flowers. Sun. 30cm.	7.50
Cephalaria dipsacoides	A looser form than C.gigantea forming a haze of tall pale yellow pincushions through late summer and equally valid for its wiry stems and seedheads through winter. Sun/Part Shade. 1.5m.	7.50
Cephalaria gigantea	A robust, handsome and long lived perennial, with pale yellow flowers, and a fine reputation as stalwart of the larger border. Sun. 2m+	7.50
Chamaenerion angustifolium 'Album'	The ethereal white flowers of 'Rose-Bay Willow-herb' always draw favourable comments unlike its terror striking running roots. Whatever - Bon courage! Sun / Part Shade. 1.5m	7.50
Chamaenerion angustifolium 'Stahl Rose'	The prettiest form of Rose-Bay Willow herb we think, pale pink with crimson calyxes. Exquisite – but how it runs! Sun / Part Shade. 1.6m	7.50
Chamaenerion dodonaei	A charming clump forming willowherb with slender greyish leaves and neatly chiselled large pink flowers. Needs good drainage. Sun. 60cm.	7.50
Chasmanthium latifolium	The intriguing flat flowers of Wood Oats are green on opening and persist in winter when they become copper flushed. Admire them in the garden or better still, pick them for the house. Sun/Part Shade. 80cm.	7.50
Chrysanthemum 'Dixter Orange'	A deeply satisfying orange, semi-double. Works wonders here in a mixed planted pot. Sun. 50cm	7.50
Chrysanthemum 'Heda'	Rare in cultivation. A deep madder red chrysanth with bright yellow centre. Flowering through October and November in Full Sun. 60cm.	7.50

Chrysanthemum 'Old White'	Elegant and airy, the small flowers burst from apricot buds and are more ivory than white. Sun. 80cm	7.50
Clematis x diversifolia var. hendersonii	Large violet-blue flowers festoon this plant. With its naturally lax habit, it may require some gentle trussing up. Sun / Part Shade. 80cm.	9.00
Cortaderia selloana 'Pumila'	Pampas Grass. From refined, narrow leaved clumps, erupt dozens of cream coloured plumes, becoming a remarkable landscape feature. Sun. 2m. AGM.	12.50
Crocosmia 'Okavango'	Flowering for months, this clump forming crocosmia has dense heads of peachy-orange flowers. Sun / Part Shade. 75cm.	7.50
Crocosmia 'Paul's Best Yellow'	The substantial rounded golden-yellow flowers go hand in hand with a plant of strong constitution. Sun / Part Shade. 60cm. AGM.	7.50
Crocosmia 'Severn Sunrise'	Everyone comments favourably on the weird peachy-rose colour of this award winning plant. Terrific with purples. Sun / Part Shade. 60cm. AGM.	7.50
Crocosmia 'Walberton Red'	A incredible deep red with large flowers and dusky green leaves. The buds have a stripy effect before they open. Wants a bit of moisture in the soil. Sun/Part Shade. 75cm.	7.50
Cyclamen hederifolium	The classic Ivy leaved Cyclamen, dormant in summer, but an autumn/winter must-have. Shade / Part Shade. 10cm.	6.50
Cynara cardunculus 'Chelsea Physic'	A spiny, aggressive brute, presumably to keep animals at bay, with deeply incised leaves. Hard to beat for architectural presence. Sun. 1.8m.	7.50
Dahlia 'Brooding Scarlet'	Graham's latest selection. A magnificent, tall dark stemmed Dahlia with a scarlet single flower. Floriferous and strong. Sun. 2m.	8.00
Dahlia 'Cardinal Star'	Our own beautiful cardinal red single Dahlia. The large flowers radiate like stained glass. Sun. 2m.	8.00
Dahlia 'Mini Jaffa'	Hardy here in the border, the small rounded flowers are a chirpy Jaffa skin orange. Sun. 1m+	8.00
Dahlia coccinea	The Red Dahlia which sometimes isn't! A spectacular species most often orangey red, but from time to time yellow or orange. Choose when in flower unless you like to live on the edge! Sun. 60cm - 1.5m!	8.00

Dahlia merckii	A refined Mexican species with good cut foliage, small lilac flowers and central boss of yellow stamens. Blooms throughout summer and is capable of being hardy. Sun. 1m+	8.00
Delphinium requienii	A self seeding annual/biennial with fleshy lobed, glossy leaves and remarkable spires of soft blue–mauve flowers in summer . Sun. 2m+	7.20
Deschampsia cespitosa 'Tardiflora'	A Karl Foerster selection of the tufted hair grass, flowering more tardily than most, from July. Prefers a moist soil. Sun /Part Shade. 75cm.	7.80
Dianthus 'Telhouet'	Plucked (with permission!) from a friends Breton garden where it made grey mounds covered in spiced clove scented vibrant pink flowers, semi double. An old French variety ?– who knows? Good drainage. Full Sun. 25cm	7.50
Dianthus ex 'Tatra Fragrance'	The parent has a striking patterned and scented form, from the Tatra Mountains. So there could be some interesting markings on these seedlings. Good drainage required. Full Sun. 25cm.	7.50
Dianthus carthusianorum 'Tall Form'	Considerably taller than the type, but with grey foliage and the same startlingly bright pink flowers. Good drainage. Full Sun. 90cm.	7.50
Dianthus deltoides 'Leuchtfunk'	Saturated crimson flowers, like splashes of blood over a mat of deep green foliage. Full Sun. Good Drainage.20cm.	7.50
Diascia 'Coldham'	A gentle pale-pink long flowering Twinspur. Great in pots or on well draining soil. Sun. 20cm.	7.50
Diascia 'Emma'	Narrow leaved suckering clumps and a profusion of dusky deep pink flowers. Exactly what we expect of these marvellous, long flowering plants. Sun.30cm	7.50
Diascia intergerrima 'Blush'	A long flowering Twinspur. White with a pale pink centre and a trailing habit. Perfect in pots. Full Sun. 30cm	7.50
Dictamnus albus	The resinous, aromatic Dittany of Crete in its orchid like glistening white form. A long lived plant, unless you have slugs! Good drainage. Full Sun.90cm.	8.20
Dierama pulcherrimum Ex 'Blackbird'	Seedlings of the strong, purple-red Angel's Fishing Rod. With evergreen, tough leaves, and yet the daintiest of flowers that dance in the wind. Sun. 1.2m.	7.80

Digitalis ferruginea	Baggy pale caramel flowers with a pouting lip. Dark sentinel spikes in winter. Sun/Part Shade. 75cm.	7.50
Echinacea purpurea 'Rubinstern'	Large purple-pink flowers, lasting for months and covered in bees and butterflies. Good drainage. Sun. 80cm.	7.20
Echinops bannaticus 'Blue Globe'	A coarse plant in leaf maybe, but worth growing for the blue, insect-attracting globes alone. Tolerant of most soils. Sun/Part Shade. 1.2m.	7.50
Echium russicum	Native to the Ukrainian Steppe, this red 'Vipers Bugloss' is a magnet for pollinators and great for chalk. Long flowering. Full Sun. 60cm.	7.50
Elymus magellanicus	South American 'Rye Grass', with blades the colour of steel. Complements purple flowering plants beautifully. Full Sun. 50cm.	7.50
Epilobium canum 'Ed Carman'	Bright orange-red, long trumpets of flower with neat grey-green foliage climbing the stem. Flowers from July. Good drainage. Sun. 40cm.	7.50
Epimedium 'Rose Queen'	Pale pink long spurred flowers emerge from the heart-shaped foliage which is bronze when young. Part Shade. 25cm.	7.50
Epimedium 'Bieke'	Masses of spidery lemon yellow flowers. Repeat flowering into summer. Evergreen. Part Shade. 30cm.	7.50
Epimedium 'Egret'	One of the best hybrids with fat white sepals and an underskirt of clean yellow petals. Evergreen. Part Shade. 30cm.	7.50
Epimedium 'Marchants Twin Set'	Our own pukka seedling with tubby bicoloured flowers of crimson–purple and lilac pink. Part Shade. 20cm.	7.50
Epimedium 'Peachy'	A Marchant's hybrid with hints of pink and yellow. Charming. Part Shade. 25cm.	7.50
Epimedium × warleyense 'Orankekönigin'	The small flowers of this selected form are burnt orange adding a quite different tone to this genus. Evergreen. Part Shade. 40cm	7.50
Epimedium versicolor 'Sulphureum'	Handsome evergreen foliage, copper and crimson tinted in winter, which should be removed in February to enjoy the clean yellow flowers in spring. Part Shade. 40cm.	7.50
